#### A Time of Silent Reflection

Consider the sackcloth. Feel the rough fabric against your skin. Throughout the Bible, sackcloth was made from coarse goat hair, which was itchy and uncomfortable to wear. People would wear clothing made of sackcloth when they were really sad and upset about their sin. Sometimes our sin is obvious; sometimes, we hardly notice it. Talk to the Lord and ask God to help you see clearly your own sin. Feel free to use the space below to journal or to draw.

- Which sins in your life make you feel sad, uncomfortable, or upset?
- Which sins in your life are you comfortable with? Which sins are you dabbling in?
- How does your sin impact your life? How does it impact those around you?
- What would it look like to turn away from sin, and toward Jesus?
- What is God saying to you?
